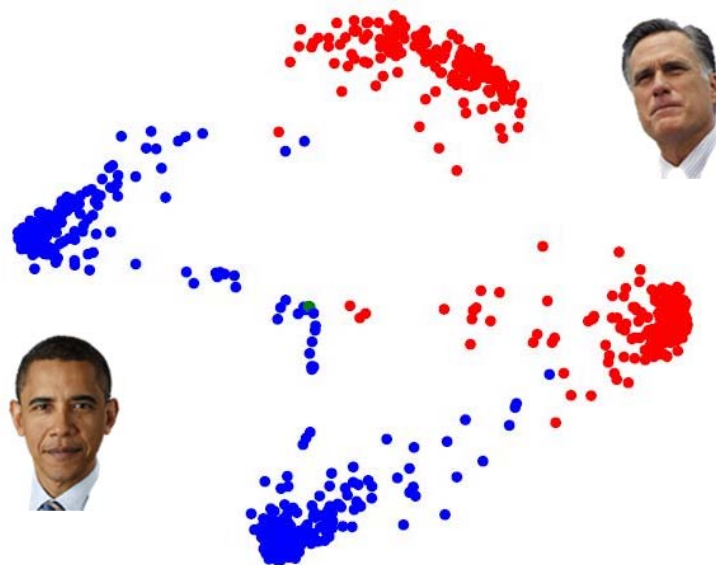
The Topology of **US** Politics

This lecture will look at a few modern data analysis techniques applied to US political campaigns. Topological tools are shedding light on the dynamics of caucus formation within parties. The lecture will not assume much technical knowledge of topology beyond some familiarity with simplicial complexes.
